ARTICLE 4. Are you in favor of adopting a maximum building height of 40 feet, to shaure adequate emergency response?  ARTICLE 5. Are you in favor of amending the Cluster Subdivisions Ordinance, with a new Cluster Neighborhoods section, which clarifies the requirements for permanently protected undisturbed open space, offers character-based incentives and design flexibility to protect the Town's historic and rural character, and, rather than as currently allowed by right, establishes a Conditional Use Permit notification process and an opportunity for residents input?  ARTICLE 6. Are you in favor of amending the short-term rental ordinance to clarify that, where they are allowed, only one is permitted per single-family home, with a two-year period of approval, and setting maximum occupancy based on septic capacity?  ARTICLE 7. Are you in favor of clarifying the definitions in the current Number of Residential Building Permits ordinance such that the number of building permits allowed is based on the number of dwelling units, and such that no person or entity can receive more than 25 percent of the permits in any given year.  ARTICLE 8. Are you in favor of revising the Table of Uses to allow limited residential use in the Commercial District.  ARTICLE 9. Are you in favor of updating the current Floodplain Ordinance to comply with the National Flood Insurance Program, so that property owners can continue to qualify for flood insurance and disaster relief?  ARTICLE 10. Are you in favor of the adoption of the zoning amendment as proposed by the Historic District Commission, for the town zoning ordinance as follows: Amend Article 13.2 by deleting the narrative descriptions of the districts and following the "purpose" descriptions of each district adding the following sentence.
